

Convergence—*a coming together from different directions, to achieve union or a common result; especially a uniting or merging of groups that were originally very different. A meeting place.* Our worship theme over these next weeks is based upon the idea of *convergence.* We will consider the foundational New Testament passages in the formation of the Church. The Church is comprised of different people with different backgrounds, cultures, interests, and abilities. Yet, in Christ, we unite! We come together from our different places and directions to a common place to form community and fellowship with one another. In Christ, we become one. The Body of Christ, however, does not exist for its own sake. It exists to worship and glorify God. It exists to be the presence of Christ in this world, uniting under His name and for His purposes. Departing this world, Jesus called His disciples unto Himself and instructed them to "make disciples." We converge so that we can mature and become better disciples. But, then, we must diverge from this place and make disciples. First Baptist lives this out through our mission to *Love People, Teach the Word, and Live the Journey* as followers of Christ.

Convergence is not easy. It is hard work. It is hard work in worship. It is hard work in ministry. It takes time. It takes commitment. It takes courage and grace. The world offers little in this quest as it prefers to polarize, demonize, and marginalize that which is different. Through Christ, we converge in order to *go and make disciples.* We must hold the coming and the going in tension. When these are out of balance, the Body suffers. And when the Body suffers, it struggles to accomplish its purpose, thus the world suffers.

Our Strategic Planning Committee has worked hard to recommend a new worship format. The proposal to call a full-time Worship Arts/Music minister and to establish early and late worship services on Sunday mornings comes after much prayer, listening and conversation. I believe this proposal creates the opportunity to converge in worship, ministry, and fellowship in new ways across our generations. Personnel and Budget/Finance Committees have engaged in the process as well. On Sept. 7 after worship we will hear specifically from Personnel to consider questions and make clarifications. The vote will be on Sept. 21. We have been praying, listening and working hard to build consensus as the FBC family responds to the Spirit of God. Let us continue in this process.

To Norman with Love is Saturday, Sept. 6. I invite you and your Sunday School class, family or ministry team to unite with the larger Body of Christ in Norman as we declare a day of service and ministry. You will be blessed, but more importantly, you will be a blessing to others.

Run the Race Sunday will be September 14. Rev. Tom Randall will be our pulpit guest. Run the Race is an opportunity for us to celebrate and support the ministry of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes in our Norman schools and at the University of Oklahoma. *Athletes that make a difference on and off the field* will join us in worship. Last year, Sallie McLaurin of the OU volleyball team shared her testimony. Through that connection, we have supported Sallie with a gift as she works with FCA in Southern California. Your generosity through your tithes and offerings made this possible.

The 125th Anniversary is fast approaching. This will be a wonderful weekend of celebrating God's goodness and faithfulness. We will look back, but we will also look forward. Former members and ministers are making plans to join us. Please mark your calendar for the events. Tickets for the Friday banquet are on sale. Ministry reunions are being planned for Saturday.

This will be a wonderful time for members to re-engage, for former members to reconnect, and for new folks to be introduced to FBC. The 125th pictorial directory is a significant part of the historical record we are creating for this celebration. Please make your appointment to participate. Those who sit for a picture receive a free 8x10 portrait and copy of the directory. We are also encouraging former members to participate, so help us spread the word. We a from out of town on Saturday of the anniversary weekend.

I visited with a couple last Sunday from the east coast who were leaving their freshman son at OU. They remarked at how warmly they were received by you and how meaningful the worship service was. Let us continue to reach out in hospitality as we welcome the stranger into our midst. Let us be the church that God calls us to be, converging and diverging from this place, to be and make disciples.






