

The 125th anniversary celebration has passed and a new 125 years of life and ministry at First Baptist begins. It has been a blessing to reconnect with former staff, members and friends of our church over these last days. The 125th anniversary team (Don Farris, Tracy Foor, Lea Ann Williams, Kay Mercer, Dot Adkins, Lauren Weatherholt, Tony Gardner, David Hopper, Cathy Gilmore and Jill Hatcher), ministers and support staff worked hard to provide a memorable weekend of fellowship and worship. I hope that you will personally say thank you to each of them.

Remembering and celebrating God's goodness, loving-kindness and faithfulness through the generations is a healthy expression of what it means to be a faith community. But, that look must not just be about our history; it must also be about our present and future. God is faithful to all the generations, including those who are here today and those who will be here tomorrow. So, let us reaffirm our commitment to being the presence of Christ in this place as we experience God's goodness, loving-kindness and faithfulness as the present generation of First Baptist Church.

During the month of November, we focus on our call to serve and share the good news of Jesus with the nations. The **Parade of Nations** on November 2, powerfully symbolizes the peoples of the world by displaying the flags of the nations. **MissionFest**, on November 9, will celebrate the opportunities church members have to go and the ongoing work of "career missionaries," who plant themselves to live, work and minister in different lands and cultures. **Shoebox Sunday** on November 16 tells of the work of Samaritan's Purse as they use gifts to open doors around the world to tell children and their families of Jesus.

One of the strengths of Baptist work is the cooperative nature in which we partner together in ministry. A portion of every dollar that you give to First Baptist supports the work of missionaries and churches across the globe. During the months of November and December, we invite you to give a special offering for world missions. These gifts go directly to our Cooperative and Southern Baptist mission partners to support the work of our missionaries. I encourage each family to make a special gift to our **World Missions Offering** this year. Moneys received are divided equally between the Lottie Moon (SBC) and Global Missions (CBF) offerings, unless you designate your World Mission Offering to one or the other. Last year we received just over \$41,000 for World Missions. **Our goal for World Missions this year is \$50,000**. How will you give to support the work of Jesus Christ around the world?

To prepare our hearts for the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons, we will host a **Service of Love and Hope** on Wednesday, November 19. The service will be structured differently from our recent Services of Hope, but will still feature an opportunity to take the Lord's Supper and to remember those who have passed over the last year. It will be a self-paced worship opportunity that you can experience individually, with family or with a small group.

Advent begins on Sunday, November 30. Our theme this year is *Peace on Earth*. ISIS, Ebola, domestic violence and murder dominate our news. We respond in fear, anger, revenge and despair. Our world needs good news! Our world needs Christmas! The Prince of Peace is born!

Immediately following worship on November 2, we will gather in Hallock Hall to thank and bless **Joey and Ashley Armstrong** for their ministry among us. We have been privileged to watch God bless their family with the births of Finn and Paisley over the past five years. They have served faithfully and effectively and now God is calling them to serve with Life Church in Broken Arrow. Joey will work to develop small groups, equipping them to serve and live missionally within their

community. We invite you to bring your cards and notes of thanksgiving and blessing as we say "thank you" with this reception.

November 2014 is a special month for the Smiths. Rev. Bob Green, the pastor of Arrow Heights Baptist Church in Broken Arrow, is retiring after 40 years at AHBC. His influence and integrity have left their mark among Oklahoma Baptists. Bob, better known as "Poppy" at our house, was my pastor as a high school youth. Celebrating 125 years of the life of First Baptist Church seems somewhat surreal to me. What was life like in this part of the world or even in the United States at that time? Looking at the Indian Territory Map, it is very interesting to see prior to the historic Land Run. This part of the Territory was surrounded by designated tribal land known only as "unassigned land." Have you ever thought what it means to be living in unassigned land? But what else was happening in 1889? Benjamin Harrison became president in March of 1889; the Coca Cola Company, then known as the Pemberton Medicine Company, was incorporated; Columbia Phonograph was formed, North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, and Washington, were granted statehood and the US grew to 42 states; the first jukebox went into operation in San Francisco, and as fortune would have it, the first intercollegiate football game was played.

A lot has changed and with all the changes in travel, communication, technology and lifestyle, we wonder how they survived. And yet it was from the midst of all that misunderstood world that this land was occupied and life began anew for families that probably had no real idea of what to expect. It was in that kind of world that churches began to make their case for Christ.

In those kinds of places through the years, churches have come into being for many reasons. It is told of some mining towns in the cold mountain country of Colorado, that churches were encouraged by business owners, or even bar owners, to attract wives and prospective wives so the men would stay and work. Here the record shows that 11 men gathered to begin worship as a new family of faith known as the First Baptist Church of Christ of Norman. Eleven men of faith took a bold step of faith to be our beginning. 125 years of history; 125 years of challenges to the church; 125 years of changing lives for the sake of Christ; 125 years of creating disciples and sending people to be on mission; 125 years and you add the rest. We have much to learn and to be challenged by in its reflection. But now the next 125 begins. It is our hands and our willingness to take huge steps of faith.

I wonder, at the 150th or 200th celebration will we be found to be as bold, adventurous and willing to take such huge steps? Will we be faithful in our communication of the gospel and grow disciples sending people out on mission? God's work in and from this place is long from over, so it will take great steps of faith to continue to progress, and be known as the people of God in this

place. We have a great heritage and with it comes great responsibility! Please

join with me in this journey to a faithful life together!

To Joey, Ashley, Finn and Paisley Armstrong: May God bless you in this new journey of faith as you see His call to move you from this place. May you touch lives in Northeast Oklahoma, as you have touched them here in Central Oklahoma. May you find peace in the journey, faith in the call, strength for the ministry ahead and a life well lived for the sake of Christ. You will be missed.
