There are many wonderful opportunities to give to relief and rebuilding organizations. Let me encourage you to give through First Baptist as we support three of our Baptist partners.

First, through our partnership with our local association (UBA/BGCO/ SBC). UBA has three disaster relief trailers and teams serving in Texas. During the Moore tornado relief efforts we hosted the UBA shower trailer.

Second, through our CBFO/CBF partnership. CBFO coordinated with us during their relief efforts in Moore. Today, they are coordinating through a sister church, South Main in Houston.

Third, through our BGCT partnership. BGCT coordinated much of their Moore relief efforts through us as well. They are heavily involved in reaching out through their churches in South Texas.

Finally, we plan to take an initial work team in the next 6-8 weeks to assist in clean-up and rebuilding efforts. Roy Joe Ham will lead and organize these efforts.
