Ur Worship as One journey continues in April as we move closer to Easter Sunday. Beginning with creation we have considered the *Mighty Acts* of God in Scripture. As April begins, we move into the New Testament to witness the Incarnation—the Word becoming flesh; God with us! Through Jesus the Son, God reveals Himself as completely as possible. Jesus explains to His disciples that when you see Him, you see the Father. So, as we experience the emotions of Holy Week, let us seek to have better awareness and understanding of what God has already revealed through His Son at the cross and empty tomb.

As Easter Sunday approaches, let me encourage you to prepare yourself through several worship opportunities. First, continue to be prayerful and present on Sunday mornings. It will prepare and leave you wanting for a glorious Easter morning. Second, we host the Norman Ministerial Fellowship's Lenten service at noon on Wednesday, April 2.

Rev. Doyle Pryor of Bethel Baptist Church will be our pulpit guest. Lunch will be served immediately following in Hallock Hall. Let's be good hosts and welcome our community and Rev. Pryor to worship and fellowship. Finally, make every effort to attend our **Maundy Thursday** and **Good Friday** services during Holy week. These services offer unique worship expressions that invite the Spirit of God to encounter you in meaningful, transforming ways. They will enhance and deepen your Easter Sunday worship.

We are blessed to cooperate and partner with the broad spectrum of Baptist life in Oklahoma. On April 11-12 we will host the Annual Meeting of CBFO. Our worship choir and orchestra will participate in worship Friday evening and there are several interesting break-out sessions and events planned. Let us be good hosts as we welcome CBFO and fellow Baptists from across our state.

It has been a blessing to watch our **Sunday Supper** ministry continue to grow. Even after canceling several suppers due to weather, word continues to spread about Sunday Supper. We had 30 first time guests at our March supper. In addition to a meal and table fellowship, our clothes closet and food pantry are open for each Supper. ministry team leadership. Thank you to all who served this past year and all who will be serving for the upcoming year. A special thank you to David Hopper who served faithfully as our Deacon Chair. I look forward to working with Harold Brooks as he begins his service as Deacon Chair. Our life together depends upon each of us finding our place of service. Likewise, we all share in the financial stewardship of our church. Thank you for your generosity through your giving to the Ministry Plan (budget), Ignite, and to the special offerings we take throughout the year. Without your faithful tithes and offerings we would not be able to support our ministries, missions, staff, and facilities as needed.

Music Ministry

Tenebrae

Any well-written musical work employs a wide range of dynamics (louds and softs.) Contrasts make the louds louder and the softs softer. Likewise, it's important for Christians to enjoy the full range of emotions of Holy Week. Too often, we put all our eggs in the Easter morning basket (pun intended) and only celebrate the fact that, "He is risen!" There is nothing wrong with that, but if we spend appropriate time remembering and actually feeling the passion of Christ – the agony of the cross - we

can more greatly celebrate His resurrection. **On Sunday** morning, April 13, Palm Sunday, the Sanctuary Choir and Orchestra will present Behold the Darkness, a tenebrae musical by Benjamin Harlan. A tenebrae service, by definition, is a service of shadows. The work will last 28 minutes and will be part of our

morning worship service.

The presentation will be meditative and reflective; no one will go out whistling the tunes. Worshippers will be led to the cross and to the tomb. As the candles are extinguished during the presentation, the approaching darkness symbolizes the flight of the disciples, the arrival of Jesus' enemies and his ultimate suffering. Total darkness reminds us of Christ's death and his burial. Musical selections are simple and brief. The narration is directly from the scripture. All will be encouraged to leave the darkened Sanctuary in silence.

Your exuberant celebration of the resurrection on Easter Sunday morning will be heightened by having experienced this meaningful work.
