Do you have a favorite Easter Story? I was a sophomore in high school and was asked to play a thief on the cross during our church's Easter pageant. I don't remember if it was Good Friday or Easter Eve, but I took my place on my cross and watched as the soldiers and mob brought Jesus down the center aisle.

They laid Him on the ground and with a mallet began to hammer a spike on a wooden block to produce the sound of nails being driven into a cross. The stage shook. A soldier cursed (I think by accident). The mob gasped and a bloodied Jesus was lifted onto His cross. I felt as if I was at Golgotha.
