



#### "WHICH VOICE DO YOU LISTEN TO?"

The past two years we have accompanied part of our family on week-long vacations for some time of

recreation and family fun. Both times we utilized the GPS navigation system to direct our journey. Also, on both occasions, we decided that since we were listening to a female GPS "voice" telling us when and where to make our next turn, we might as well give her a name. Last year, it was Mildred...this year it was Margaret.



Mildred and Margaret joined our traveling company. They spoke directions so often that, in some surreal way, they seemed like part of the family. Most of the time instructions were right on target and we "obeyed," but there were occasions when, for whatever reason, their direction was not entirely accurate and we had to make adjustments. We would jokingly respond by saying, "Mildred, you missed that one." Our granddaughter, Lynlee and grandson, Stew hardly knew what to make of the interaction with a "voice inside a box." Perception became reality and they probably wondered if either Mildred or Margaret actually existed in real life.

Last year upon our return, Lynlee, during her nightly prayer time, thanked God for "Mildred" because we couldn't have made it without her. We all chuckled at her estimation of Mildred and how real that voice must have been to a four year old

This raises some interesting questions for all of us. What voices do we listen to? Do we trust those who tell us what to do, where to go, how to act, what to believe? How real has the voice of God become to us?

It seems to me that we treat God in a similar way to how our family treated the GPS voice on those trips. We want to believe God's instructions and many times we obey. But then there are those times when in our stubbornness or defiance we think we know better and often we pay for our mistakes. Unlike the GPS system, God doesn't have any skewed directions. We never need to correct Him, for He is always faithful and always committed to our good.

What voices are you listening to these days? Is God at the top of your list? I hope so, because Mildred and Margaret only exist in a box, but God is

the real deal.

#### Ignite Challenge

**Ignite Summary** We are now one year and counting in our three year Ignite Commitment Season and great things continue to happen. As you can see because of your commitments, prayer and faithful generosity our project progress is significant. Our Generis Consultant continues to be amazed at the generous progress of your faithful giving. \$3,127,007.61 was committed to be given over a three year period and after 12 months you have sacrificially given \$1,528,581.68. Because of this giving we anticipate that it will be sometime in the first quarter of 2014 before we have to utilize

any of our construction financing. As your faithful response to your commitments continue, we also look forward to having all of the Phase One Projects paid for with no debt by the end of our three year commitment period or before. That is an exciting testimony of your faithfulness.

**Project Progress** Each week we see more evidence of the work being completed. The inside work continues. I hope that you go to the church website to see pictures of the progress. New air conditioning ductwork is almost complete on all three floors, most of the new wall framing is complete, new plumbing rough-in work continues and new electrical work is beginning. Of course, the exterior work that is evident is that the stair/elevator tower concrete stem wall is poured and backfilled. This week the masonry contractor will begin work on both the new south entry stairs and the elevator tower. Yes, much progress is being made. We anticipate to use the new entry stairs by the season of Advent. Hopefully, around June 1 we will re-enter the east wing. We all look forward to that.

**Budget Giving** This continues to be a focused need. While our capital project giving is ahead of schedule, our budget giving is falling behind. Thanks to those who evaluated times in which you may

have missed your regular giving and responded. This has helped in the early weeks of October. We need to anticipate the end of year giving and finish the calendar year well. In recent years, both November and December have shown to be the end of year giving months. I want to thank you in advance for your prayerful consideration in your part of finishing well.
