

ur next **Sunday Supper** will be October 6 at 4:00 p.m. in Hallock Hall. The Sunday Supper is a result of our recent season of prayer and conversation as we considered the needs of our congregation and community in relation to the Friendship Lunch. The themes of outreach, discipleship, security, community and loving/serving others formed the crux of the conversation. We asked where we saw God moving. First, we are excited about the ongoing ministry of our **Friendship Sunday School class.** This class developed from the Friendship Lunch and is a transformational place of fellowship, Bible study and sharing life. We look forward to this group continuing to grow and deepen as part of the life of First Baptist. Second, we recognized the void and need in our community on Sundays for food and shelter. We reached out to Food and Shelter, Inc. and discovered a willing partner. With the support of our church and other churches, Food and Shelter is able to open its doors on Sunday mornings through the lunch hour. Breakfast, shelter, basic services and lunch are now offered to anyone with that need on Sunday mornings through this

"Kingdom" effort. Through this partnership, First Baptist continues to participate in a Sunday lunch ministry. Would you be willing to volunteer one Sunday? Finally, we will host a Sunday Supper on the first and third Sundays of each month in Hallock Hall at 4:00 p.m. (The early supper time allows us to finish before dark every Sunday throughout the year.) On first Sundays, we will have a spiritual focus with opportunities for devotions, seminars, music, testimonies and other spiritual emphases. On third Sundays, our food pantry and clothes closet will be open after supper. Everyone is invited to participate and many of our ministry staff are getting involved as well. We need folks to serve, clean and simply sit at tables to talk and pray with those who come. Let Angela Atkins know how you would like to help. We look forward to seeing the fruit of this new ministry effort.

I wish to say thank you to Jennifer McMillen for her service as our Children's Ministry Assistant and as the Executive Director of our Fee Based Programing these past few years. In addition to helping with our regular Children's Ministry programming, Jennifer has provided administrative support and leadership for Kaleidescope, Summerscope, SummerSonlight, Parent's Day Out and Sonlight Preschool. We look forward to her ongoing presence and ministry at First Baptist.

Run the Race and Block Party will be Sunday, October 27. Run the Race is our annual worship service with the Norman Chapter of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Music Ministry

We are blessed and amazed at the newest and certainly youngest member of Sanctuary music leadership staff, **Elliot Ringwald**. Let me introduce him to you.

Elliot joined our music staff in the fall of 2012, when he began his studies at the University of Oklahoma, as a student of Dr. John Schwandt. Previously, he studied for five years under Abel Searor, a



graduate in organ performance from the University of Syracuse. Elliot began playing the organ at age 12 when he discovered the instrument growing up in New Haven, NY. His parents, Fred and Karen, and his older sister Cena, were very supportive of his musical endeavors. Both parents have been amateur musicians. His father works at the nuclear power plant in Oswego, NY, as a procedure writer; his mother is a homemaker who enjoys working with the local art association. In 2009, Elliot took a position at the Pulaski Baptist Church in Pulaski, NY, as choir director and organist at the age of 16!

NY, as choir director and organist at the age of 16! Elliot says he finds our "non-textbook" service a variable challenge that stretches his musical muscles. He also works at the American Organ Institute where he refurbishes and constructs pipe organs. The knowledge and experience he has gained through this work has already been put to good use keeping the organ at First Baptist in good condition.

He looks to graduate with a bachelor's in organ performance from OU in the spring of 2016. He will continue toward a Doctorate of Music Arts. With this degree, he'll find work as a university professor or as the music director for a large church.

Let me encourage you to stay five minutes at the end of worship, or walk over to the Sanctuary to enjoy one of Elliot's varied and creative postludes, but also to introduce yourself and express your appreciation for his exceptional contributions to our Sanctuary worship services.

I wanted to share with you our recent journey of faith and blessings. Our family experienced a great loss in 2007 with the death of Charles' sister. Her two boys (Marques, currently 8 and Jayden, 6) moved away to Florida with their father in 2009. This was very difficult since they were



the only memory we had of their mother. We kept in touch with them over the phone and through cards, but in 2011 things began to change and we became aware that the boys might not be in a loving home.

We went to Florida to have a visit with the boys in June of 2013 and while we were there, the boys were removed from the home. This is where we began to see the Lord provide us with His blessings. First, we were able to get an emergency hearing before a judge who approved for them to come to Oklahoma for an extended vacation. Another blessing is that their grandparents had driven from Oklahoma to Florida, so the boys were able to ride back with them while we flew back to prepare our home for their arrival. God provided us with donations of furniture, clothing, toys and bicycles. We were also blessed with a wonderful pediatrician who helped to stabilize them medically. It has been wonderful to watch the Lord work in our lives.

The most recent blessing came from FBC Norman and the connection to a sister church in Kissimmee, Florida. The state was unable to get the legal paperwork finalized for the boys to stay before the start of school, so they had to return to Florida. I called Crystal, our Children's Minister, to see if the church could help and by God's providence, we found a wonderful Christian family to host them in Florida until they could return. Leaving them was difficult, but knowing they were in a loving Christian home was extremely comforting. We have since brought the boys back to Oklahoma and are currently working through the final documents, so please keep us in your prayers! I know the Lord will continue to provide us with His blessings as He has this entire journey.
