Last October, we had just completed three years of Ignite focus and generous giving and we had a loan balance of about \$370,000.

Through August this year we now have a loan balance of \$94,675. Certainly your faithfulness continues to meet that need along with the regular ministry plan needs that we face. This brings our Ignite giving total through the end of August to \$3,178,182.

Consider the fact that over the past 47 months, that amount has been offered as sacrificial giving above your regular giving. Thank you and praise be to God for your faithfulness. I look forward to finishing well and completing the giving to phase 1 of our capital needs by the end of the year.
